第一題:中翻英【30分】

Poorly educated men in rich countries have had difficulty coping with the enormous changes in the labor market and the home over the past half-century. As technology and trade have devalued brawn, less-educated men have struggled to find a role in the workplace. Women, on the other hand, are surging into expanding sectors such as health care and education, helped by their superior skills. As education has become more important, boys have averagely fallen behind girls in school. Men who lose jobs in manufacturing often never work again. And men without work find it hard to attract a permanent mate. The result, for low-skilled men, is a poisonous combination of no job, no family and no prospects.

Volkswagen has set aside €6.5 billion to cover the costs of the growing scandal over cheating on emissions tests in the US. Putting a number on the cost further down line will be far harder, however, as it is a crisis which calls into question the ethical credentials of the company and the industry, as well as posing tough questions about the regulators and authorities who were duped

Although the Volkswagen emissions scandal has caught many by surprise, in fact it has been brewing for a while. It all started when the European wing of the US NGO International Council on Clean Transportation (ICCT) set out to prove modern diesels were genuinely clean and would therefore be able to make a significant contribution to improving both CO₂ emissions and air quality.

The US has higher emissions standards than Europe, which were regularly passed by VW's diesel-fuelled cars. The ICCT decided to test why this was the case—and had some surprising results. Partnering with a team from the University of West Virginia, the team fitted portable emissions testing equipment to three vehicles (two VWs and one BMW) on a run from San Diego to Seattle, which turned up very disappointing results for the VWs. The VW Jetta tested on the road trip exceeded NOx (one of the regulated toxic emissions) standards by 15 to 35 times the legal limit.

When similar vehicles were subjected to their official test in the California Air Resources Board's laboratory, however, they passed. The road test emissions numbers in the lab all fell within the accepted levels of NOx emissions. Following investigations into the matter, VW has admitted to gaming the US air pollution tests. Nearly half a million cars have been recalled for containing "defeat device software" that only turns on the cars' emissions controls when they are undergoing official testing.

第二篇:

When we walk through the world in our daily life, we think that our eyes are sending information to our brain which it then processes to show us an accurate view of "the real world." But the truth is that what our brain shows us isn't exactly what our eyes are seeing. Our brain is constantly interpreting everything we see.

The brain creates shortcuts in order to quickly make sense out of the world around us. It receives about 40 million sensory inputs every second and it's trying to make sense of it all. It uses rules of thumb, based on past experience, to make guesses about what we see. Most of the time that works, but sometimes it causes mistakes.

We have two types of vision: central and peripheral. Central vision is what we use to look at things directly and to see the details. Peripheral vision is the rest of the visual field - areas that are visible, but that we're not looking at directly. Being able to see things out of the corner of our eye is certainly useful, but research from Kansas State University shows that peripheral vision is more important for understanding the world around us than most people realize. It seems that we get information on what types of scene we are looking at from our peripheral vision.

Researchers conducted an experiment and showed people photographs of common scenes, such as a kitchen or a living room. They found that if the central part of the photo was missing, people could still identify what they were looking at. But when the peripheral part of the photo was missing, then they couldn't accurately guess what the scene was. They concluded that the central vision is the most critical for specific object recognition, but peripheral vision is used for getting the overall impression of a scene.

第三篇:

Norway is mostly known for its natural beauty, **fjords** and mountains, the amazing Northern Lights and the Midnight Sun. The Kingdom of Norway is a constitutional monarchy located in Northern Europe, the western portion of the Scandinavian Peninsula. Geographically Norway is located about as far north in Europe as you can get, and hosts the northernmost point of Europe-the North cape cliff. It is part of the Scandinavian peninsula.

Norway has a population of about 5 million, and it is the second least densely populated country in Europe, with a majority living in Oslo and the eastern parts of the country. Norway has a very elongated shape, one of the longest and most rugged coastlines in the world, with some 50,000 islands off this extremely indented coastline. A vast number of **fjords** are cutting their way from the coastline into the country, carved out by the ice. The **fjords** are quite unique and beautiful, but naturally they have also been a challenge for the road planners. Thus a ferry crossing the fjord is a typical sight in Norway. In fact, the ferries are defined as part of the road systems.

The Arctic northern part of Norway is densely populated, with no railroad connections north of Bodo and very few roads, and the roads are often closed during the winter due to heavy snowfall. One might expect the sea to be frozen during the winter months due to the northern latitude, but the sea is in fact always open thanks to the current passing along the coast. Naturally the sea has been the "main road" for the population along the coast.

Fishing has always played an important part in Norway's economy, due to the vast coastline and mountains covering large areas of the country. Only the eastern parts of southern Norway has a topography suited for agriculture and larger farms. Along the coast people typically have a minor piece of soil for a cow and some potatoes, combined with fishing.

第四篇:

Martin Luther King Jr. delivered his "I Have a Dream" speech on August 28, 1963, at the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom. Many regard it as the greatest speech of the twentieth century and, more than that, one of the greatest speeches in history. Though King was one of several featured speakers that day, "I Have a Dream" became synonymous with the aims of the march and the entire civil rights movement. His dream represented the dream of millions of Americans demanding a free, equal, and just nation.

A scholar and a pastor, King was able to combine academic, political, and biblical elements in his "I Have a Dream" speech. He referenced the Bill of Rights, the Declaration of Independence, the Emancipation Proclamation, and the Bible. When delivering his address, he spoke with accessible language and used repetition to drive home important points; the phrase "I have a dream" is repeated nine times in the speech. Though King had a script in front of him, as the speech progressed and the crowd responded, he began to improvise his message. In fact, the "I have a dream" section, the most well-known portion of the address, was entirely extemporaneous. The power of this section is a testament to King's oratory skills and the conviction with which he spoke. Just as his namesake Martin Luther sparked the Protestant Reformation in the sixteenth century, King and his "I Have a Dream" speech emboldened his followers and changed history.

"I Have a Dream" comprises a large part of King's legacy. Portions of the speech are instantly recognizable and have become part of America's culture. King's dream became the nation's dream, and it did not die when he was assassinated in 1968. That year, his widow Coretta Scott King founded the King Center for Nonviolent Social Change in Atlanta, Georgia, as a way of furthering her husband's work for change. In 1986, King became the only twentieth-century figure whose birthday has been designated a public holiday, celebrated on the third Monday of January. However, it was not until 1993 that Martin Luther King Day was celebrated in all fifty states.
